2 SCHOOL CURRICULUM MATTERS

2.1 Ensuring Optimal Curriculum Delivery [Repeat Announcement] (P1 to P6)

Due to scheduled public holidays including Labour Day and school activities such as Meet-the-Parent (MTP) session falling on Fridays in Term 2, the school will be making the following arrangements to ensure optimal curriculum delivery. Friday lessons will be conducted on **Thu 28 May**:

2.2 School-Based Assessments – Weighted Assessments (P3 to P6)

Assessment is an essential part of the teaching and learning process. It provides pupils with opportunities to consolidate their understanding, recognise their strengths, and identify areas for improvement.

We would like to thank all parents for partnering with us and supporting your child's learning journey. We hope you will continue to do so by encouraging your child to engage in regular revision and practice, striving for excellence and always putting their best foot forward.

Letters on the weighted assessment for Semester 1 which include the schedule, topics and other details have been sent to parents of P3 to P6 pupils via PG in Term 1 Week 4.

2.3 Mid-Year Holistic Development Profile (HDP) (P3 to P6)

The school will issue the HDP on Tue 26 May (Term 2 Week 10) to inform you of your child's learning. It will reflect mid-year remarks, conduct, personal qualities and attendance. In addition to the above, P3 to P6 Mid-Year HDP will consist of weighted assessment results. You can look forward to receiving the holistic development report of your child and take the opportunity to find out more and discuss with your child about his/her learning in the respective areas.

2.4 Reminder on PSLE Matters (P6)

In view of the shift towards onscreen marking of PSLE scripts, pupils are reminded to adhere to the following requirements when answering:

- Use only **dark blue** or **black ballpoint pens** with **0.5mm** tip size
- **NOT** to **highlight answers**
- **NOT** to use **correction tape/fluid**

Kindly ensure that your child has the above-mentioned ballpoint pens and are familiar with their use.

3. SCHOOL PROGRAMMES

3.1 校园书香日 World Book Day @School Programme (Mon 04 May to Fri 29 May) (P1 to P6)

To mark the global celebration of World Book Day on Thu 23 Apr, P1 to P6 pupils will participate in the "World Book Day @School" programme between Mon 04 May and Fri 29 May. The aim of this programme is to nurture a love for reading Mother Tongue Languages (MTL) books. Pupils will engage in a range of reading-related activities on the "Reading Monopoly" (阅读大富翁), such as writing simple book reviews on their favourite book or character in the story, story editing, participating in class discussions, completing activities in the Reading Passport (P1 to P3 pupils) etc. To encourage creativity and active participation, the top three submissions from each class will receive tokens as a reward. Pupils who have completed the "Reading Monopoly" (阅读大富翁) stand to win prizes.

For pupils taking Chinese Language, they will be introduced to the "Unboxing the Treasured Memories" graded picture book series, specially developed by the Singapore Centre for Chinese Language (SCCL) and the Committee to Promote Chinese Language Learning (CPCLL). For pupils taking Malay and Tamil Languages, they are encouraged to choose and read their favourite books, either from home, the class library or school library, before taking part in the reading activities. For all P1 to P3 pupils, they can also enjoy reading the supplementary readers from the MTL SOAR programme.

5.3 Meet-the-Parents (MTP) Session and E-Learning Day (Fri 08 May) (P1 to P6)
